An association of synagogues and other religious, education, fraternal and community organizations, the Northeast Queens Jewish Community Council (NEQJCC) covers Bay Terrace, Bayside, Bellerose, Douglaston, Floral Park, Fresh Meadows, Glen Oaks, Hillcrest, Holliswood, Hollis Hills, Jamaica Estates, Little Neck, New Hyde Park, Oakland Gardens and Queens Village (north).

A beneficiary of UJA-Federation, the NEQJCC works closely with the Metropolitan Council on Jewish Poverty ("Met Council"), Samuel Field/Bay Terrace Y ("The Y"), Parker Jewish Institute for Health Care and Rehabilitation ("Parker"), Queens Region-Hadassah and Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater New York ("JCRC").

Council projects include neighborhood development, Jewish continuity including *Shalom Bayit/Healthy Marriage*, Lay Leadership, social action, promoting involvement and volunteer opportunities, fostering intergroup understanding and building a multi-cultural coalition. The Council combats anti-Semitism and discrimination, sponsors forums with major public figures, Jewish cultural events, open discussions with local Rabbis and represents community concerns. Its newest program, the **Harmony Initiative** or "HI" represents a collaboration funded by the City Council including the Office of the Queens District Attorney, the City Commission on Human Rights and the Northeast Queens Branch-NAACP. As part of its Neighborhood Development efforts, the Council helped form the **NORC-WOW**, a pilot program to serve seniors in one and two family homes. The Council publishes a (4-fold 8.5 by 14-inch) brochure, *You Can Have It All*, touting life in northeast Queens Communities, also available through its website.

Annual programs include its Installation of Officers and Awards Reception sponsored by each fall by Parker, lighting of the largest Chanukah Menorah in Queens (this year on December 17), a Pre-Passover and Fall Food Drives sponsored by Parker, Met Council and The Y, and a Purim Carnival at the Samuel Field Y. Each Spring, the Council holds its Annual Legislative Forum, co-sponsored by Parker, Met Council, JCRC, The Y, and Queens Region-Hadassah, at the Samuel Field Y. In 2002 and 2004, the Council, together with Queens Region Hadassah and the Consulate of Israel, hosted the Ben Yeduda Street Comes to Bayside, an Israeli Gifts Fair, which attracted thousands of visitors who purchased direct from Israeli merchants and listened to Israeli entertainers.

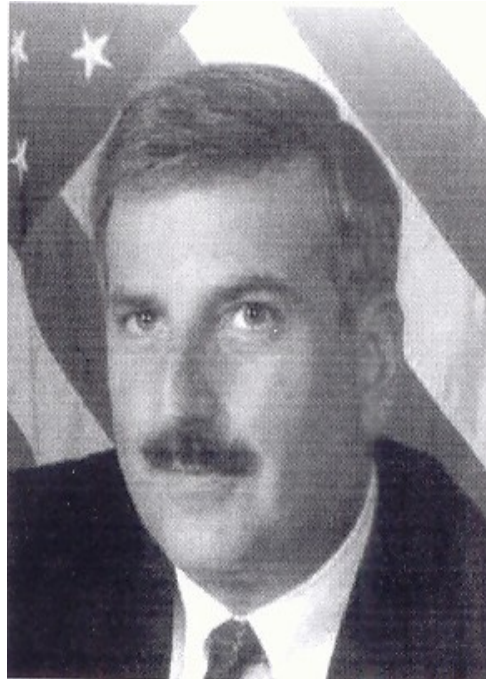

Corinne Steel

Corinne Steel's volunteerism is a core piece of her life. Not only is she active in Jewish charitable work, but she is also a director and secretary of The Bay and Paul Foundations, on the Advisory Board of AERO, a supporter of the Millay Colony for the Arts, and a member of the Whitman Society of the Marine Biological Society in Woods Hole, MA. She always begins by directing her energies to a small aspect of the organization, but ends by becoming the person who steps into any position where her wisdom and expertise are needed. Because of her work at The Bay and Paul Foundations and in honor of a recent birthday, the Foundations created and funded The Corinne Steel Prize for Outstanding Senior Honors Thesis written in English 89 or English 89.2 at Brooklyn College.

A graduate of Hunter College High School, Corinne went on to Brooklyn College and became a librarian in a Wall Street law firm. As a young stay-at-home mom, she directed her energies initially to the North Shore Leukemia Society, but gradually became more active in her children's public school, making her way up the ladder to co-president of the P.T.A. A member of Marathon Jewish Community Center for forty-two years, she has participated in Sisterhood-sponsored Oneg Shabbats at Creedmoor, served on the School Board and with the P.A., and has been a long-time member of the Center's Board of Directors. Her love of music brought her to Marathon's choir, and her interest in theater got her involved with the Marathon Little Theatre Group where she served as a producer.

During a vacation at Tamiment, in the Poconos, fifty-four years ago, Corinne met Leonard Steel. They became engaged after one week, were married within the year, and began their life together in Little Neck, where they still reside. Their children, Stephen, Hillary and Brian brought spouses Richard and Colette into the family, and then came Chloe, Beatris, Jacob, Bari and Alisa. To the younger members of this "organization", Corinne proudly serves as Grandma.

She currently holds the position of secretary of the NEQJCC, and will be installed as 3rd vice-president at its breakfast in October. She will also be honored there for her work with the Salute To Israel Parade, where she served as liaison for the past three years. "It has been a joy", she says, "to watch our contingent grow to over 300 marchers and spectators. Each time, being with my synagogue, with my community, with my people, was beyond wonderful."

Outstanding Service to the Community of Greater New York

Hon. David I. Weprin

Northeast Queens Jewish Community Council is pleased to recognize the special contributions of one of our city's outstanding public servants, City Councilman David I. Weprin. Though he continues to distinguish himself as Chair of the City Council's Finance Committee, we especially honor David's special public service and work on behalf of his constituents in eastern Queens and the entire city.

David represents the 23rd District covering all or parts of the northeast Queens communities of Bayside, Bellerose, Douglaston, Floral Park, Fresh Meadows, Glen Oaks, Hollis, Hollis Hills, Hollis Park Gardens, Holliswood, Jamaica Estates, Little Neck, New Hyde Park, Oakland Gardens and Queens Village.

Prior to his election as our Councilman in 2001, David held prestigious positions in the securities industry, including as chair of the Securities Industry Association, NY District, from 1997 – 2000. From 1987 –2000, David worked as Senior Vice President and Managing Director in Public Finance for four Wall Street firms - Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette; Kidder Peabody; Paine Weber, Inc.; and Advest, Inc. He previously served as Deputy State Banking Superintendent and Secretary to the New York State Banking Board from 1983-1987. He also served on the NYC Tax Reform Commission.

Born in Queens, David Weprin has lived in the Hollis-Jamaica area his entire life. He is a graduate of Jamaica High School, SUNY at Albany, with a cum laude degree in Political Science, and the Hofstra University School of Law, which also honored him as a Distinguished Alumni.

David is deeply engaged with the Jewish community. Prior to his election, he served on the boards of the Metropolitan Council on Jewish Poverty which presented David with its Founders Award in June 2002, and Queens Jewish Community Council. He served through June 2002 as a Vice President of the Northeast Queens Jewish Community Council which recognized him later that year with its Outstanding Service to the Community of Northeast Queens Award.

He remains active at the Young Israel of Holliswood and the Young Israel of Jamaica Estates and the National Committee for the Furtherance of Jewish Education, the American Jewish Congress, and the Brandeis Association (Jewish lawyers). He is also active in the community at large serving since 1994 as Democratic District Leader and Executive Member of the Saul Weprin Democratic Club, named after his late father and the NYS Assembly Speaker, and the Holliswood Civic Association.

David lives with his wife Ronni in Holliswood. They are the proud parents of five children.

Outstanding Service to the Community of Queens

Michael N. Rosenblut

Michael N. Rosenblut, MBA, LNHA, RHP is President and Chief Executive Officer of Parker Jewish Institute for Health Care and Rehabilitation, in New Hyde Park, New York, one of the nation's preeminent health care and rehabilitation centers for older adults.

Mr. Rosenblut administers the Institute's highly regarded sub-acute and long term care programs, as well as prominent geriatric medical education and research centers. He is responsible for a wide-ranging constellation of community health programs, encompassing the region's largest adult day health care program, Alzheimer's day care, long term home health care and hospice programs. Under his stewardship, Parker has undertaken a variety of progressive clinical, management and environmental initiatives, including new programs in wound care, pain management, palliative care and behavior modification, a new computer infrastructure, and comprehensive building renovation and modernization. A champion of the "home away from home" health care environment for older adults, he has implemented and enhanced numerous patient-centered innovations, such as concierge/patient liaisons, same-day admissions, buffet dining, and a 24-hour patient/family hotline.

Previously the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, and then Acting CEO of the Institute, Mr. Rosenblut has played a crucial role in the development of culturally sensitive health care programs, including a Jewish community hospice division. He has helped to shape a marketing program firmly integrated into the region's civic, religious and community fabric, and has fueled Parker's leadership in collaborative labor-management projects, including quality improvement training, certified nursing assistant mentoring, cost containment forums, and nationwide advocacy for a fair health care budget.

The former Chief Executive of Jewish Home for the Aged, in New Haven, Connecticut, Mr. Rosenblut's experience also includes positions as Administrator of Hillcrest Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, Spring Valley, New York, and Associate Administrator of Hebrew Home for the Aged at Riverdale.

Michael N. Rosenblut earned a Bachelor's Degree in Public Policy from the State University of New York at Albany, where he was the recipient of the University President's Undergraduate Leadership Award, and an MBA from Long Island University in 1992, where he was elected to the Academic Honor Society of the Graduate Business School. In addition, he possesses Nursing Home Administrator Licenses from New York State, New Jersey and Connecticut.

Under Mr. Rosenblut's hands-on leadership and vigorous support, the innovative professionals of Parker Jewish Institute are preparing to mark the Institute's second century of health care service to seniors with advances in patient care, teaching and research.

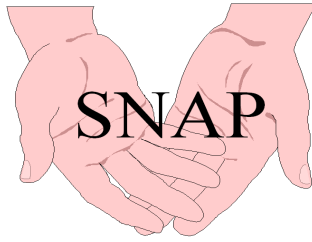

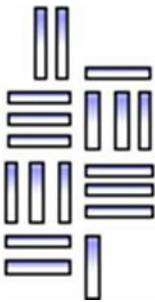

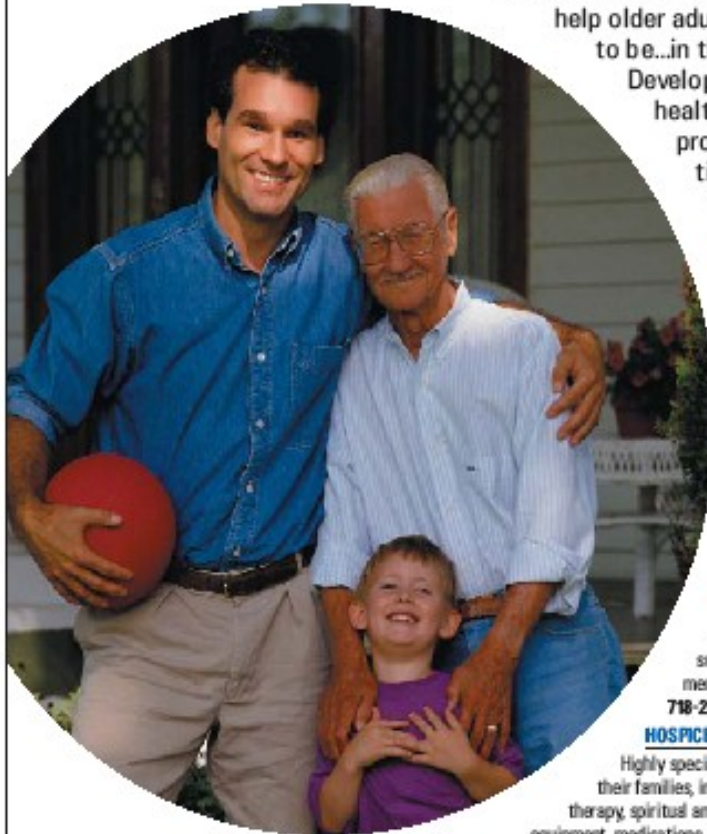
